Individual soloists will be giving late night recitals lasting about 30 minutes, as last year, after the main concerts.

The Occasional Singers are returning to join in another innovation; an evening of prose, verse and song presented by Hilary Bosworth and John Surry.

This year the finale concert will be on Friday evening and the festival will end with a Ceilidh in the village hall.

6pac Jazz Sextet

The award winning **6pac Jazz Sextet** play some of the great classics of traditional and modern jazz

6pac Jazz Sextet has worked extensively throughout the UK since they formed in June 2002 whilst studying at the Royal Northern College of Music. In June 2004 6pac were awarded the RNCM Gold Medal, the highest accolade for performance that the College bestows, and the only time in its history that an ensemble received the award. Later in the same year the band received the Peter Whittingham Award for Innovative Jazz from the Musician's Benevolent Fund for their project, 'Last Minute Changes'. This led to a tour of northern universities and their subsequent debut CD featuring brand new music by young people and the band themselves, available through the website.

The band continues to perform new music as well as putting their distinctive mark on jazz standards. Their second album, 'Business as Usual', has now been released. The band performs all over the UK, from the Isle of Wight to Dunfermline, at festivals including Manchester, IOW, and Peterborough; chamber music societies including St Martin in-the-Field, Macclesfield, and Saddleworth; and weddings everywhere else! **6pac** have also performed for BBC Songs of Praise. Education and outreach work is also an important part of the groups work. As well as being part of the Live Music Now scheme, **6pac** also holds its own week-long summer school as part of Dartington Plus in Totnes, Devon.

Hilary Bosworth, John Surry and **The Occasional Singers** will be taking a largely light-hearted look at Children and Parents, Love and Marriage with the help of, amongst others, Thomas Hardy, U A Fanthorpe, Daisy Ashford, Fleur Adcock, Connie Bensley, Ralph Vaughan Williams, Gustav Holst and Gerald Finzi. The evening will open with an instructive world première.

Hilary and **John** are members of the Encore Theatre Club and played Mr and Mrs Hardcastle in the recent production of "*She Stoops To Conquer*" at the Bridport Arts Centre. In 2004 they appeared as father and daughter in "*The Heiress*", a scene from which is included in the programme.

The Occasional Singers, directed by **Rick Birley** and **Richard Hall**, are well known to West Dorset audiences. This will be the third year that they have taken part in the festival.

Workshop for young musicians

A chance for children of all ages, whatever their instrument, to come along, play and have fun in a morning workshop taken by some of our visiting musicians, and then, in the evening, perform in an orchestra alongside artists taking part in the Festival. Mid morning refreshments and snack lunch will be provided. The evening concert will include solo performances by guest musicians.

Amongst those taking part will be:

Adrian Bradbury (cello), who read Veterinary Sciences and Music at Churchill College, Cambridge, before further study at the Royal Academy of Music and in Berlin. He is cellist in the Composers Ensemble (winners of the Royal Philharmonic Society Ensemble Award in 2002) and other leading chamber ensembles and gives regular Performance Classes at the RAM where he is also Music and Science co-ordinator.

Claudia Lashmore Bennett (flute) who since finishing her graduate and post graduate degrees at the Royal Northern College of music two years ago, combines a busy freelance life with teaching at the prestigious Cheethams Music School in Manchester.

Bridget Pearse (violin) is well known locally and her experience spreads across the classical and folk world.

The young players will be joined in the afternoon by the Festival's artistic director, **David Juritz**, who combines a busy solo career with that of leader of the London Mozart Players, and is guest leader of the Royal and London Philharmonic Orchestras, amongst many others.

Founded in 2004, the trio perform regularly at major concert halls in Europe including the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, Nybrokajen in Stockholm, and the Purcell Room, Barbican. As well as playing throughout their native countries of Britain, the Netherlands and Sweden the trio has also performed extensively elsewhere in Europe Germany, France, Latvia, Poland, Hungary, Romania and Cyprus. For two years they held one of the prestigious Leverhulme Chamber Music Award Fellowships at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London where they studied with David Takeno. They have won awards from the Kirckman Concert Society, the Park Lane Group and the Worshipful Company of Musicians which resulted in their debut recital as well as a subsequent recital at Wigmore Hall in 2006. Since 2006 the trio has been regularly invited to give concerts for the Holland Music Sessions 'New Masters on Tour' and they are selected artists for the Concert Promoters Network, UK. Their performances have been broadcast live on BBC Radio 3 and Dutch Radio 4/Avro.
