FROM THE RECTORY

As we look again at the Christmas scene in Bethlehem

what do we see? Do we see something romantic surrounded by the soft glow of candlelight, or something redeeming overshadowed by the harsh outline of a cross? Do we see just a simple baby - or a special baby?

Isaiah the prophet wrote words that he felt God the Father was saying foretelling the coming of Jesus. *"Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him"* Isaiah 42:1. *The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him—the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD"* Isaiah 11:2.



Jesus later as a young man read and related to himself the prophecy of Isaiah 61:1 *"The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners"*.

Jesus the babe of Bethlehem came to earth to be this life-changing servant of the Lord.

As I am writing this letter the 'powers that be' are short-listing applicants for the post of Rector for our Benefice so that our church reps might, later, prayerfully discern on whom God's calling and Spirit is resting to God's servant leading us in the Bride Valley into the future together.

As that process happens it is worth considering Isaiah's words regarding 'the servant of the Lord' asking how they might relate to the choice to be made. And all of us, during Advent, are invited to think about how these words were ultimately fulfilled at the first Christmas in the coming of Jesus, THE servant of the Lord, who said that he had come *"...not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many.."*

A happy Christ-filled Christmas, and a blessed New Year for us all

Following on from a successful trip to Brownsea Island last summer, this year we chose to visit the churches of the Bride Valley, to ring the bells where possible, or to simply appreciate the individual beauty of the churches if the bells were not in action. 8 ringers from Long Bredy took part, with **Gordon** from Litton Cheney making a welcome addition to our band for the day.

The day started gently at St Michael and All Angels, Littlebredy, chiming their 6 bells, followed by hearty bacon butties, courtesy of **Brian** and **Ann** at Pitcombe, before winding on down through the valley to St Mary's at Litton Cheney. After an energetic session with all 8 bells here, we crossed the valley to St Mary the Blessed Virgin at Puncknowle and Holy Trinity at Swyre, chiming 2 bells in each tower. Lunch was a delicious ensemble of


homemade soup, cheese and fruit, very welcome after the exertions of the morning.

From Swyre, it was back across the valley to Chilcombe, and although we couldn't get in, we left a gift of a bell rope in the porch. Then on to St Martin's at Shipton Gorge where we rang their 6 bells from the ground floor chamber, marvelling at how light they were!



Our penultimate stop was at St Mary the Virgin in Burton Bradstock, before heading back to our home tower at St Peter's, Long Bredy for a final ring on our familiar 5 bells. The day ended with sandwiches and cake in the church, and a welcome cup of tea!

The day was a huge success, with each ring of bells different from the last, either in the way they were rung or chimed, or the access to the ringing chamber. A big thank you Litton Cheney, Puncknowle, Swyre and Shipton Gorge for letting us enjoy their bells and of course to our own captain, **Gwen**, for arranging the whole outing!





PLANNING APPLICATION

The Hall Trust was advised that its application to replace all ageing steel windows with UPVC replacements would be refused. As a result, the application was amended to Aluminium windows very similar in appearance to the current steel ones, but 80% more expensive. JOBS TO DO IN DECEMBER AND JANUARY

This is the time of year to ensure everything is prepared for next spring; continue winter digging, adding homemade compost or well-rotted manure; clean pots and trays with mild disinfectant; clean, oil and sharpen tools; have mechanical tools serviced. Clear leaves from the crowns of herbaceous perennials and alpinas as they are vulnerable to rot in prolonged damp conditions. Sow pelargonium seeds under cover. In the vegetable garden create a seed bed and place a cold frame over it to warm the soil, early crops can then be sown directly inside. Plant shallots; regularly check stored fruit and vegetables. Keep feeding the birds and ensure they have access to clean water, especially in frozen conditions
