#### SURVIVING WINTER APPEAL 2014/2015

Surviving Winter Dorset is an annual campaign which raises donations for elderly and vulnerable in the county. The appeal is encouraging people who receive, but do not need, their Winter Fuel Allowance to donate it in order to help the elderly stay warm and well over the winter months.



Statistics show that on average there are 500 cold weather related deaths every year in Dorset, with the majority of casualties being over 65. Only one in 100 excess winter deaths is caused by hypothermia, however a large percentage of deaths is due to exacerbated health conditions. Social isolation and transport in rural Dorset can be a real problem for the elderly in the winter months too.



In response to continuing financial pressures on the DWP and its seven partner councils, the partnership is looking at a range of options to make its HRC service more cost-effective.



- Closing all HRCs for two or three weekdays. (Potential savings up to £300K a year)
- Charging residents to dispose of non-household materials, such as DIY waste and tyres. (Potential savings £250K a year)
- Charging Dorset residents to use their HRCs in neighbouring areas, which the DWP currently subsidises. (Potential savings £70K a year)

Residents can read the consultation information and complete an online questionnaire at <u>www.dorsetforyou.com/hrc</u>. Those unable to go online can pick up a questionnaire at the main borough, district and county council offices, all HRCs and libraries in Dorset.

The consultation starts on **Wednesday 26 November** and will finish at midnight on **Friday 13 February 2015**.
