# PUNCKNOWLE, SWYRE AND WEST BEXINGTON BOOK GROUP

Our April read was 'The Visible World' by Mark Sloutka. It was a love story set during WW2 in Czechoslovakia and the events surrounding the assassination of Reinhard Heydrich (Commander of the Nazi protectorate of Bohemia and Moravia) in May 1942. Following his death there were merciless reprisals by the SS against the Czechs. The novel has three sections: Memoir – in which a boy tells of growing up in NY with his Czech parents and their friends; Intermezzo – in which the son returns to Prague to find out what part his mother had played during the War and who her secret lover had been. The final section Novel describes his mother's involvement in the Resistance and her love for one of the assassins. Mark Sloutka is himself an American and the son of Czech immigrants. Some members found the book difficult in its structure and content and rather slow paced but a couple of us really enjoyed it.

# **GREAT WAR SACRIFICE REMEMBERED**

Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> May sees the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death at Hill 60, near Ypres, of Private Alexander William ("Will") Sanders of Vine Cottage, Shipton Gorge. Will Sanders joined the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion of the Dorsetshire Regiment as a volunteer in 1914 and died aged 21 along with 150 of his comrades as a result of the second chlorine gas attack ever mounted by the Germans in World War I. A commemorative full peal of bells will be rung at St Martin's Church from 9.30 a.m. on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May by



members of the Dorset County Association of Church Bellringers. Will's great-niece, **Barbara Montgomery**, will be present as his sacrifice is remembered at the church where he was a keen bellringer, having rung the bells on the last Sunday before he was sent to the Western Front.

### JOBS TO DO IN MAY

Feed border lilies; thin sedums to keep the flowers upright and compact later in the year; prune spring-flowering shrubs when they have stopped blooming. Plant up hanging baskets and large pots for summer flowering, protecting them from any late frosts. Gradually harden off young crops before planting out in the vegetable plot towards the end of the month.

Protect crops from carrot root fly. Pinch out the tops from broad beans when they flower to discourage blackfly. Divide prolific marjoram/oregano plants. Fruit bushes, trees and strawberries benefit from a good soak from time to time, rather than a quick splash more often.


