It was only long after that I took this photograph from the tower of St. Mary's Church that I realized that I'd caught a relatively uncommon experience in Burton Bradstock – a traffic jam! Look in the top right hand corner of the composition and you'll see a van and a small motorhome meeting one another on the corner of Mill Lane and Church Street. The rest of the composition is open and free, with the two pathways through the churchyard radiating from the porch. The topmost path is one I see in finer detail these days: motor neurone disease means that my progress, using the wheelchair, is very slow and I've got to know each flagstone more intimately as they pass one by one beneath my unsteady feet. What amazes me now, looking at this aerial view (taken two summers ago when I was fit and well) is how beautiful those two forked pathways look from above.

In my mind these stand for the radiant energy that we hope can be released from our worship spaces through our praise of God. Praise not only reaches out to the source of all creation, the God who made all things and is continuing to shape our universe. Praise makes our lives bold and shapes us for living and loving. Praise anticipates the salvation which, through Jesus' resurrection, extends beyond this life. These three themes, Creation, Life and Salvation, will be at the heart of a trio of Songs of Praise services at St. Mary's, Burton Bradstock this July, August and September. At each service, the hymns that are selected will mark the three themes described earlier and my hope is that the energy of our praise will radiate outwards, towards both God and the community. Do come and join us.

CHRISTIANS AWARE STUDY PERIOD IN THE SOUTH WEST **REMEMBERING**

A Study Period commencing at 09.45 on Friday, 9 June 2017

St Mary's Church, Powerstock, West Dorset

This Study Period is designed for those who, each Remembrance Sunday, pause for thought after saying 'we will remember them', realising that most of those whose names appear on their war memorial today are unknown within their community.

Approaching the commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the First World War, the parish of Powerstock decided to mark the centenary by calling for volunteers to adopt and research each of the First World War deceased with a view to the self-publication of a book, *A Dorset Parish Remembers*, to rehabilitate their dead and forgotten. The following year the same treatment was given to those lost in the Second World War.

This was a remarkable community effort. The 'how' and 'why' is the general topic of the Study Period. The keynote address will be delivered by the Bishop of Salisbury. Other speakers will include a trustee of The Memorials Trust on the subject of *Monuments and Memorials*, and various contributors to *A Dorset Parish Remembers*.

Lunch and loos are available in The Three Horseshoes opposite the church. A main course of fish and chips, curry, or vegetarian are each priced at £10. Desserts as shown on the menu. The session will conclude with ecumenical Communion followed by a pub social. Musicians are encouraged to bring their instruments to the pub social after the event.

Jobs to do in June

Transplant pot-grown dahlias and cannas, tender summer bedding, halfhardy annuals and tender perennials outside. Place hanging baskets in a sheltered sunny spot, water and feed them regularly. Prune spring-flowering shrubs. Sow biennial Sweet Williams, wallflowers and foxgloves in a nursery bed in preparation for flowering next year. Plant out squashes/pumpkins/ courgettes, runner beans, sweetcorn, leeks, outdoor tomatoes and melons. Keep sowing salad crops and now is the time to sow herbs: parsley, chervil, dill, coriander and basil.




