## BOOK CLUB REVIEW



**The Lighthouse** is the first novel by the English writer, **Alison Moore**, and was shortlisted for the Booker Prize in 2012. The central character is Futh, a middle-aged Englishman, who catches the ferry to Germany for a walking holiday. Recently separated from his wife, the journey is a repeat of a trip taken with his father after his mother left them when Futh was a child, and retracing their steps stirs the memories and feelings of abandonment that have stained his life throughout his adolescence and into middle age. A parallel character is Ester, the unhappy wife of a German hotelier, who tries to gain her husband's attention by cheating on him, and when the paths of these two characters cross, tragedy ensues.



Futh keeps with him an antique silver perfume bottle holder in the shape of a lighthouse aquired, not necessarily rightfully, from his mother, and the themes of warning, repetition, and the search for something as illusive as the scent of violets, create a feeling of loneliness and bleakness throughout the novel. The sad ramifications of care-less and insufficient parenting, and the damaging consequences of decisions that are selfish, or lacking in self awareness bring a strong sense of forboding to this understated and well written book.

### JOBS TO DO IN AUGUST

Keep cutting sweet peas to prolong flowering. Cut back hardy geraniums. Prune lavender and rambling roses. Take cuttings from tender perennials such as pelargoniums and fuchsias. Apply a general liquid fertiliser to lilies after cutting off the flower stalks. Keep camellias well-watered.

Feed salad crops in containers with a high-nitrogen liquid fertiliser. Continue to sow spring cabbages. Raise marrows off the ground to aid ripening. Fill any bare soil in the vegetable patch with fast maturing crops. Plant strawberry runners. Pick and hang up herbs indoors before storing them in jars

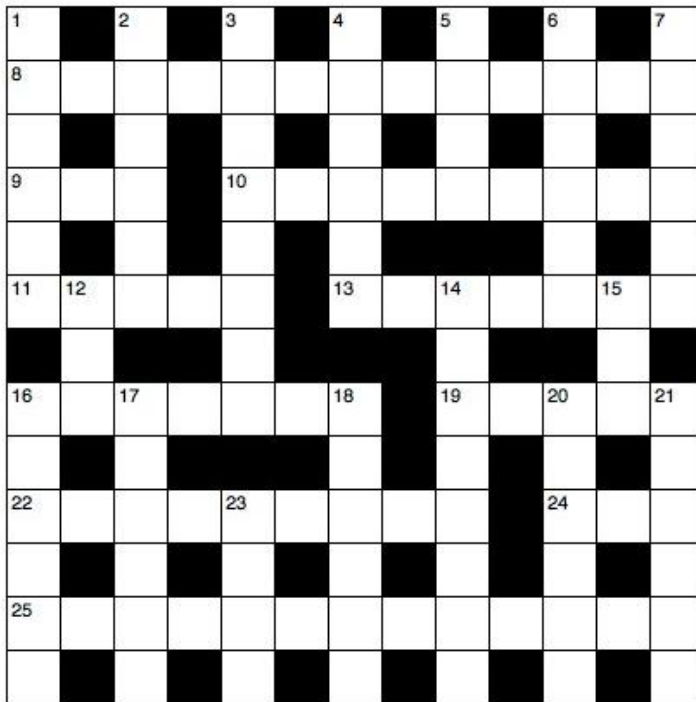

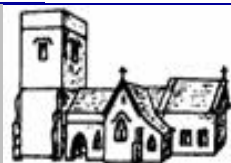
