

The PCC has approved suggestions for 2015 when we will be supporting Farm Africa (charity number 326901) and **The Sailors' Society** (charity number 237778):. More details of specific events will follow later (especially for those who like to knit!). Information about the charities themselves is below:

Farm Africa's local staff provide the tools and expertise to enable smallholders in eastern Africa to increase their harvests, whether they farm crops, livestock, fish or the forest. They train them to be more commercial, adding value to surpluses by milling, drying, or turning their produce into products that fetch a higher price. With better food for their families and reliable incomes from their businesses, farmers can build for the future.

Eight out of ten rural Africans scrape their living from small plots. Soils are often poor, drought ever near. Farm Africa brings in the smart crops, drought-busting techniques and marketing skills that make such tough farming viable, profitable and sustainable. Where land is arid and crop cultivation hard, many farmers make their living by keeping animals. Farm Africa helps with basic animal health services.

Farm Africa is pioneering fish farming in Kenya, which ensures sustainable protein supplies and a major new source of income. They also help forest communities replace traditional tree-cutting and wood and charcoal selling with new eco-friendly enterprises that protect biodiversity and provide a sustainable income for future generations.

The Sailors' Society provides a personal lifeline for merchant seafarers on board ship and when they step ashore in port. Founded in 1818, the Sailors' Society is a not-forprofit Christian Society associated with all the free churches although it remains independent and not directly affiliated to any one particular church. **The Society** is present at many of the key ports around the globe where it maintains a staff of professional Chaplains who are experienced in multi-faith and cross-cultural work. Chaplains and volunteers assist thousands of merchant seafarers each year; extending a hand of friendship, hospitality and pastoral care to all those seafarers they meet regardless of their rank or circumstance.

The Society people meet seafarers right where they work – on board the huge variety of cargo and cruise ships at the strategic ports of the world. They also bring with them practical services like SIM phone cards to connect with loved ones at home, the latest newsprint in many languages and are able to change foreign money into local currency for shopping etc.
