The training of nurses and particularly, midwives, are also being funded to save lives in a country where maternal and perinatal deaths are among the highest in the world. We thoroughly enjoyed the genuine falafels, made by a Sudanese lady from Exeter, and the donations of £190 will make a difference to this small charity.
