1st Reading: Genesis 32 verses 22 – 31

Jacob Wrestles at Peniel

²² The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. ²⁴ Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. ²⁵ When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." ²⁷ So he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." ²⁸ Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed." ²⁹ Then Jacob asked him. ³⁰ So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved." ³¹ The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip.

Feeding the Five Thousand

¹³ Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. ¹⁴ When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. ¹⁵ When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves." ¹⁶ Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." ¹⁷ They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." ¹⁸ And he said, "Bring them here to me." ¹⁹ Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. ²⁰ And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. ²¹ And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Reflection

Faith is often incomplete, fearing that God will only help us in certain ways or to a limited extent, on the contrary, he meets all the needs of those who turn to him abundantly, without limit.

In a conversation about the feeding of the five thousand earlier this week the remark was made: "It's all about the foodbank, isn't it, that has to be the modern version of the feeding of the five thousand." And in a sense it is, of course. BUT, it is so much more than that ... Ironically in the same conversation about the foodbank, Helen, the new curate in the Bridport team told how she'd spent the morning counting 200 tins of beans at the Foodbank, to which the response was; "Be thankful you weren't asked to open each tin and count the beans inside also!"

And that's the point, to make us think: there is so much more to God's provision and we often limit it.

It must have been a miserable crowd of people by the time evening began to fall and it grew cold in that desert place. The excitement of following this new healer and teacher had kept them buoyed up through the day, but now hunger and tiredness set in and overcame their enthusiasm. Some of them muttered about these religious folk who care nothing about the needs of ordinary people. Their enthusiasm was turning to hostility. As for the disciples, they were sick of people crowding round their Master and wanted only to be alone with him. "Send them away" was a cry that he heard from them all too often. The idea of sharing their meagre supplies among such a crowd was the last straw. But the voice of authority overcame their complaints, and they all sat down as he commanded them. He had taught and healed many and now fed them until they could eat no more. Tentative hope grew into total satisfaction. Replete and content, they did not even know that they had seen a sign of the Messiah. The miracle of the manna in the wilderness was even more bountifully repeated. In a different way to Jacob, he had seen also God face to face.

Guide me O thou great Redeemer, Pilgrim through this barren land I am weak but thou art might, Hold me with thy powerful hand. Bread of heaven, Feed me till I want no more. (William Williams)

Let us pray: Bountiful God, teach me to trust you for everything. When my hope is weak and my faith grows dim, help me remember how often you have overcome my fears and met my needs more abundantly than I could have imagined. **Amen.**

Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
