The Bride Valley Service for Sunday 27th September 2020 Trinity 16 (We will be lighting a candle in church and you may wish to do so at home, if it is safe to do so)

Greeting

Prayer of Confession

God our Father, we come to you in sorrow for our sins. For turning away from you and ignoring your will for our lives; Father, forgive us: **Save us and help us.**

For failing you by what we do and think and say; Father, forgive us: **Save us and help us.**

For letting ourselves be drawn away from you By temptations in the world around us; Father, forgive us: **Save us and help us.**

For living as if we are ashamed to belong to your Son; Father, forgive us: **Save us and help us.**

Absolution

The almighty and merciful Lord Grant you pardon and forgiveness of all your sins, Time for amendment of life, And the grace and strength of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Praise

Blessed is the Lord, for he has heard the voice of our prayer; Therefore shall our hearts dance for joy, and in our song we will praise our God.

Collect

Lord of creation, whose glory is around and within us, open our eyes to your wonders, that we may serve you with reverence and know your peace at our lives' end, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

First reading Philippians 2 verses 1-13

If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.

Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

Gospel reading Matthew 21 verses 23-32

When he entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and said, "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?" Jesus said to them, "I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" And they argued with one another, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' But if we say, 'Of human origin,' we are afraid of the crowd; for all regard John as a prophet." So they answered Jesus, "We do not know." And he said to them, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

"What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' He answered, 'I will not'; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir'; but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him.

Reflection

"You can talk the talk, but can you walk the walk?" Back in the early 2000s I used to lead a Youth Group and this was our motto. It's basically the theme of today's gospel reading, isn't it! What those religious leaders needed to see was that talking about faith and religion is not enough, you actually have to live it out in your actions, in your daily life. It is the son who gets around to taking action who is recommended, rather than the one who airily talks about it, yet does nothing.

Having been to the dentist for a routine check-up recently we discovered that there was something terribly wrong with one of my front teeth and I was heading for disaster. The thing was I had no pain or trouble warning me that there was a problem. It was just the vigilance of the dentist that she was able to warn me that there was an issue. And that the issue needed to be dealt with in order to avert the inevitable future pain and potential loss of the tooth. I've yet to come across someone who likes going to the dentist and most people I talk to are similar to me – I hate going to the dentist! But I definitely hate toothache more. Low and behold on removing the original filling the situation was much worse than first thought and I ended up having root canal treatment. It hurt! I'm not going to go into any more detail than that for fear of traumatising you or bringing back memories of your own dental experience. I decided that while I was sat there unable to talk for over an hour I would use the time to pray for everyone I knew that needed my prayer, including the poor dentist! I feel sorry for them, it can't be an easy job, the intricate skill required to undertake the treatment as well as the fact that most people are so afraid of them.

And it made me think, we hand over our dental treatment to the dentist, (or not, in some cases.) We trust the dentist to put things right, to look after our dental health, even though it's sometimes painful, to look ahead and alert us to future problems. To show us what steps to take now to avoid future pitfalls and problems, to help and advise us how us maintain good oral health and hygiene.

Isn't that a bit like a regular check in with God? Now I'm not suggesting we do that on a 6 monthly basis, no, no, no! Regular check-ins with God need to be at least daily. That way we can put things right immediately, look after our relationship together, even though it's sometimes painful, we can plan ahead and be alert to face future problems. Even alert us to what steps to take now to avoid future pitfalls and problems, and help us maintain good and healthy spiritual choices.

The truth is that God promises to teach us how to make good choices and through Jesus and the Holy Spirit he is working within us, inspiring both the will to do good and also the act of carrying it out.

We can also be involved in the kind of caring, encouraging relationship with God which really does make a difference. It really does enable us to tackle those wrong areas in our life, head on. We are never too old, too set in our ways or too busy to take God up on his offer of live-in help in our daily lives. **Amen.**
