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John 11. 32-44

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?" Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus looked upward and said, "Father, I thank you for having heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me." When he had said this, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet bound with strips of cloth, and his face wrapped in a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

Reflection

The gospel story takes us to Bethany, to a family in despair, believing that Jesus has not prioritised them in their predicament and that his turning up now is too late and somewhat pointless.

You may not be surprised to know that I am very interested in this little town situated near Jerusalem, after all, I have a daughter named Bethany. I will tell you in a moment about our trip there in 2010.

Opinions are divided on the meaning of the name of this town, some say it is the House of the poor and this indicates that it was the site of the almshouse. Others say its name means the 'place of care', I'd like to think the two would go hand in hand. Another popular opinion is simply House of Figs!

This story of Lazarus being raised from the dead is very familiar, we must have all heard it and variations of interpretation over the years. Looking afresh at it this week I can't help see how much Mary and Martha

had given up hope. Who can blame them, after all their brother had been dead for 4 days, there were already the signs of decay, the stench of rotting flesh. Surely there was no hope.

And then the unthinkable happened and Lazarus was raised from the dead, with Jesus saying ... "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?"

"Unbind him, and let him go." He's alive!

This got me thinking – have we given up hope? Do we also think the good news of the gospel is too little, too late?

When I took my Bethany to the Holy Land, the thing I was most looking forward to was taking her to visit the place she was named after "Bethany'.

But by the time we got there we had visited so many churches and ancient sites that she had had enough! She was only 12! When we got to the entrance of the cave where Lazarus had been raised from the dead and the rest of our party were desperate to go inside – she refused! And I mean totally refused ... so we let everyone else go past us and we sat on the side of the pathway.

I was so disappointed, as you can probably imagine.

But then something amazing happened, which would not have been possible if we have gone underground! As we were sat on the side of the road waiting for the others a young muslim boy aged about 5 and his mum came out of a little gate and he sat down with his lunch, I can only describe it as a mix between a cake and a honey sandwich and both Beth and I looked at it because we were wondering what it was. His mum soon disappeared and came back with a sandwich for each of us – she must have thought we were looking because we were hungry. Despite the language barrier we managed to thank her and the four of us just had a whale of a time together, just a short time but we shared and laughed and it was just the tonic that Bethany needed. Such welcome and hospitality, it was a moment that neither Beth nor I will ever forget. A God moment, when all is well with the world.

Reading this account for today and remembering back then I realised that God is so interested in each one of us, he knows exactly what we need and ... when we need it.

Even though Mary and Martha had given up all hope. Jesus never let them down. He was there for them, he did what they needed him to do.

Even though the last 18 months and probably even before that have been disappointing for our churches here across the Bride Valley. God knows. He hasn't given up on us, as individuals, as a church here, as the Christian presence within our communities.

Together let's continue to hope for a time when by believing we too will see the glory of God, here with us, here in this place. Our God is well and truly a God of surprises. Our hope is built on nothing less. Amen.
