### Reflection

One of my favourite TV programmes is 'Who do you think you are?'

I love to see peoples faces when presented with evidence about their history, and see documents and photos of their grandparents and great grandparents', learning about their birth, life experiences, jobs, marriages, children, their deaths, and their wills.

I love to hear the searchers wows of wonder when learning about different parts of their heritage, and what is in their DNA - who they are! When, sometimes discovering about a lordly predecessor and property, the question is asked: Is there any inheritance left for me?

Peter writes about 'Who' we are as Christians and about our heritage and Hope: He writes about

- knowing our spiritual birth or re-birth
- knowing about our eternal inheritance which is found and founded on Christ's death and resurrection Let's look at the documents we have before us!

Peter says in 1Peter1:3 according to His abundant mercy God has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you

Our spiritual 'birth certificate' says: according to His abundant mercy Father God has begotten us again through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Through Christ we are given life - life eternal!

Looking at Christ's 'death certificate' 1Cor15 says: Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures

Saint John says in 1Jn1:9 the blood of Jesus Christ cleanses us from all sin

God promises us, through faith in Jesus and his death on the cross for us, we have forgiveness. Through trusting in Jesus and his work we have a future

1Peter1:4 says God has begotten us again to a **living hope** through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, **to an inheritance** that is incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

As children of God resurrection life, perfect, permanent and personal, is promised to us

-Forgiveness of the past is indisputably given and -hope for the future is fully guaranteed

This is the Easter message that Christians have and hold on to. Who do we think we are?

1st We are <u>children of God</u> - we are *born again* (literally: birthed spiritually from above) by Christ, and activated by personal faith in him - It's not by 'being good', not by religious rituals, but by confessing Jesus Christ, like Thomas, as 'MY Lord and My God'

Who do we think we are? We are children of God and as children of God we become citizens of Heaven and inheritors of eternal life. There's a place in heaven reserved for us with our name on it

All this is given to us through Christ's death, and guaranteed through Christ's resurrection. However it is activated by personal faith in Jesus. Do we believe this? Have we received this?

So let's do that now in our Prayers

First a prayer of Christian commitment

Holy God I admit that I am a sinner needing your grace. Thank you Jesus you died to forgive all my sins, and rose to give me life eternal. Please pardon my faults and failing; come and fill me by your Spirit with your living presence; and make me a child of God. Jesus be my Lord in this life and lead me safely to your home in heaven. For your glory's sake I pray this Amen

Then, as God's children we can confidently pray the Lord's Prayer saying

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name

Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven

Give us this day our daily bread,

and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive them that trespass against us

And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen

Finally we make our Intercessions

- *-For the church.* where there is success give humility, where there is confusion give light, and where there is suffering give courage. Lord in your mercy **Hear our prayer**
- For the world and those in authority. Where there is need give your provision, where there is war give peace, where there is hunger give food, where there disaster give hope. And for King Charles as he prepares for his coronation give him your holy anointing of righteousness and godly direction

Lord in your mercy Hear our prayer

- For our communities. Where we live give harmony and neighbourliness, and make us lights in the darkness. And for Jane and Nigel as they prepare to leave us give them your serenity, and for ourselves give us faith and a new priest who will lead us in your paths of mercy and truth

- For the needy. Where there is sickness of body give endurance and healing, where there is disquiet of mind give assurance and courage, and where there is a troubled spirit give comfort and true faith in the power of our risen Lord Lord in your mercy hear our prayers Amen

We **Declare our Faith** in words from 1 Corinthians 15:5-7 Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, he was buried; he was raised to life on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; afterwards he appeared to his followers, and to all the apostles. **This we have received and this we believe** Amen
