#### First reading: Isaiah 40. 12-17, 27-end

Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of the Lord, or as his counsellor has instructed him? Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt offering. All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness.

Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God'? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

#### Second reading: 2 Corinthians 13. 11-end

Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints greet you. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

- 1 Thou whose almighty word chaos and darkness heard, and took their flight; hear us, we humbly pray, and where the Gospel-day sheds not its glorious ray, let there be light.

## Gospel reading Matthew 28. 16-end

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

#### Reflection

Those words from Psalm 8 instantly transport us to moments of wonder, awe and mystery when we've gazed up into the night sky, or when we embarked on midnight expeditions to places far from street lights on balmy summer evenings, to count the Perseids meteorite showers; or returned home

at the end of a long day and gazed up at the stars on a clear frosty night before shutting the door behind us. Viewing the Southern Cross in the heavens above on travels in the southern hemisphere; or on a night passage on a sailing holiday; or even seeing a glittering array of stars near and far, small and faint, large and brilliant, from a bedroom window.

Each time we glimpse a star-filled sky we can feel afresh the enormity of the universe in a way that not even the most expansive daytime, mountaintop view can afford. The night sky transports us from this planet into the farthest reaches of the cosmos, spatially and chronologically, for the light of a star may have taken unimaginable spans of time to reach this tiny speck called Earth. It resets our sense of perspective as the heavens declare the glory of God (Ps 19), since this is as nothing compared with the creator God whose work it is.

This infinite God reveals himself to us and makes his dwelling with us in time and space as well as in the eternity of dark and light. Sometimes we need simply to soak in this spectacle, no matter how limited our understanding of it may be.

**Great is the mystery of faith ...**It's Trinity Sunday, a day when we celebrate God as three in one and one in three.

The Trinity is one of those topics which can leave everybody feeling confused, but we can also use it simply to describe how amazing God is. God is so big, so wonderful and so far beyond our imaginations that to our minds he really doesn't seem to make sense! God is a mystery. So, if somebody comes up to you and says, go on then, you're a Christian explain the Trinity then your response could be simply to say:

"The Trinity is a way of us saying as Christians that God is much bigger and more complicated than we will ever know ... God is a mystery that we humans cannot solve."

In our gospel reading Jesus makes this clear that there is one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit and that he will never leave us.

It's important to see God as Trinity because:

- It gives us a balanced view, protecting us from an inadequate perspective of God.
- It is biblical, it is seen throughout the New Testament.
- It shows our source and destiny as LOVE.
- It gives us a model for our relationships, and it challenges our fundamental values.

As human beings it meets our basic psychological needs, giving us;

- a point of reference FATHER
- an inspiring role model SON
- a helper/facilitator/presence with us Holy Spirit.

God meets us wherever we are and meets our need of him in such a basic way.

I'm excited to see the continuation of God at work here among us, sometimes where we expect, but often in the unexpected too, in the inspiring conversations, in one of the God moments, where it is clear that the Holy Spirit is among us and reaching out before us. Today, as we celebrate God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, let's give thanks for all that means in our lives as individuals and as a worshipping community, united across the local churches and across the whole world.

Let us pray: Holy God, we thank you for all that you are, all that you do among us and for what lies ahead for our future. **Amen.** 

#### The Apostle's Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.
