

THE REVEREND LIZ HOWLETT'S TRIP TO THE US

Liz is about to head off to the States for the month of October! The trip is all about her research in connection with Adela Marion Curtis (1867 - 1960), the founder of the first community to live where Othona West Dorset is based.

There is nothing to suggest that Adela Curtis ever went to the US herself, but she was profoundly influenced by New Thought, a North American spiritual movement which was brought to this country around the turn of the 20th century. It is not well known in this country these days, but is still a strong movement in the States and indeed in other parts of the world. Part of the reason for going to the States is to meet people who live by New Thought principles today. Another factor is that one of Adela's sisters, Clara, emigrated to the States and her great grandson lives in Kansas City.
