- 23 "His lord said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord.'
- 24 "Then he who had received the one talent came and said, 'Lord, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you have not sown, and gathering where you have not scattered seed.
- 25 'And I was afraid, and went and hid your talent in the ground. Look, there you have what is yours.'
- 26 "But his lord answered and said to him, 'You wicked and lazy servant, you knew that I reap where I have not sown, and gather where I have not scattered seed.
- 27 'So you ought to have deposited my money with the bankers, and at my coming I would have received back my own with interest.
- 28 'Therefore take the talent from him, and give it to him who has ten talents.
- 29 'For to everyone who has, more will be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who does not have, even what he has will be taken away.
- 30 'And cast the unprofitable servant into the outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

- 10 who died for us, that whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with Him.
- 11 Therefore comfort each other and edify one another, just as you also are doing.

### Reflection

This period Before Advent is the time when we celebrate the coming King and the Kingdom of God - in our day and in what the Bible calls 'the last days'

There are 2 opposite views about the 'last days', and where the world is going.

- One group believes that life will improve till (as one of our carols puts it) comes round the Age of Gold
- On the other hand people say that the world will deteriorate to the point where only Christ the King can fix it, a time when, as we declare in our Creeds, 'Christ will come again to judge the living and the dead' He will return to reign and change everything.

Zephaniah, the Old Testament prophet, 600yrs before Jesus wrote in ch1:14: The great day of the LORD is near; it hastens quickly (changes will happen so fast) . The noise of the day of the LORD is bitter (it's unsettling) when the mighty men shall cry out with their demands. That day is a day of wrath, of trouble and distress; of devastation; desolation; darkness and gloomy depression, of clouds, of trumpets and alarm against the fortified cities and high towers.

God says: "I will bring distress upon men, And they shall walk like blind men, because they have sinned against the LORD; Their blood shall be poured out like dust, their flesh like refuse. Their silver and their gold won't be able to deliver them in the day of the LORD'S wrath; The whole land shall be devoured by the fire.

Zephaniah sounds very much like he is reporting the news in our day. And that's what the 'last days' will be like.

S Paul in 1Thess1 wrote to the Thessalonians (& us) in similar terms

The Lord shall come as a thief in the night, as you yourselves know perfectly well. When they say, "Peace and safety!" then sudden destruction comes upon them, as labour pains upon a pregnant woman. And none shall

The Bible tells us that these 'Kingdom of God' times will be about both blessings and troubles, and will culminate in the return of the King; when everyone will have to give an account of what we have done

Jesus in his stories in Mtt25 talked about a time of 'calling to account'; a day of 'sorting things out'; an occasion of repayment or reward for what people have done (or not done) with the life and gifts God has given to us

If God sends the sun and rain on the just & the unjust, & provides for our needs ......then, we are accountable for all the things he has given to us. We are *stewards* of his gifts; and answerable for what he has entrusted to us.

The question is: What have we done with the days & times, gifts & opportunities that he has given to us?

When we stand before him what will we say to him and what will He say to us?

Jesus says in Matthew 25

- to the faithful he will pronounce his favour; 'Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter the joy of your Lord.
- to the sinful, segregation; to the lazy, loss; Cast the wicked, lazy, & unprofitable servant into the outer darkness

The Day of the Lord will be a day of sorting out

Zephaniah says: It shall come to pass at that time, that I will search Jerusalem with lamps, and punish the men who are settled in complacency, who say in their heart, 'The LORD will not do good, Nor will He do evil." In other words He's not bothered one way or the other - we can please ourselves!

But God says "No" - it doesn't work like that. Their goods shall become booty, and their houses a desolation; They shall build houses, but not inhabit them; They shall plant vineyards, but not drink their wine."

There are consequences to carelessness, as there are rewards for readiness.

So St Paul concludes: Let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober. Those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night. But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, that whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with Him.

Therefore comfort each other and edify one another, just as you also are doing.

God wants to give us grace, not judgement

2Corinthians 5:10 bluntly tells us: We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body

Over this time of Advent, let's get ready for the glorious coming of our King Jesus, seeking his forgiveness and doing what he wants, so that when he comes we might be welcomed into the 'heavenly kingdom'
