

THE DIOCESAN VISION: MAKING JESUS KNOWN 5. FINANCING THE FUTURE SUSTAINABLY

It is essential we confront the financial challenge we face so we can plan for the future, to ensure our local churches are able to offer ministry and care to our children and grandchildren. "God has given us all we need – how are we going to use these gifts for his glory?" Questions to consider:

- How can we engage the wider community in thinking about generosity?
- As you consider the future of mission and ministry in your local area, what financial resources might you deploy to support the provision of people and buildings?
- How can your own generosity make a difference to others?
- Are there additional opportunities to work with others to raise money, apply for grants or establish new income through for example a social enterprise?
- How might your church community begin to talk about money as part of discipleship?
- What information would support you doing this; how might you best engage people?
- Are there other choices which could be made locally, or within the wider diocese collectively, to finance the future of mission and ministry as you Make Jesus Known?
- How can the local church begin to free itself from the burden of finance, to be the people God calls us to be? What difference will it make?

THE TELEPHONE/RECORDED SERVICE

The latest Benefice Council meeting discussed the ongoing viability of the telephone service which started in Covid lockdown and enables listeners to dial up a local rate line to hear a service recorded by one of the Ministry Team - a friendly voice for those unable to make it to church. More recently, services recorded have reduced to 2 or sometimes 3 a month, but the cost to the Benefice remains at £30 a month - and we have recently discovered that there are sometimes just two telephone listeners for these services. Another option for a telephone service has also become available, listening via the Daily Hope line, so PCCs have been asked to consider whether we continue to record a service and just send it out via email, continue with the telephone service or just use Daily Hope. Anybody who has any thoughts on this should pass these onto their PCCs as soon as possible.
