The latter will be James Webster's final service as an LLM as he is retiring. James will be leading the prayers and Revds Liz Howlett and Margaret Preuss-Higham the service.

VACANCY AND WAY FORWARD

Following the lack of applications for the post of Rector and the meeting with the Archdeacon last week, it has been decided to rework the Benefice profile again, making it still more succinct. The Diocese will leave the advert on their website in the hope that somebody might just spot it in the meantime and AD Penny will try to organise a new advertising and interviewing date in the Spring/Summer. It was pointed out that, in the week of the advertisement, there were 14 pages of clergy vacancies and that Rural Ministry posts are generally harder to fill. The issue of the Rectory was also discussed and it was agreed that a letter would be sent to the Diocese, emphasising the necessity of sorting out the housing situation prior to the next advert. Please continue to pray that God will prompt someone to feel that this is their next stage in their ministry.

THE TELEPHONE/RECORDED SERVICE

The latest Benefice Council meeting discussed the ongoing viability of the telephone service which started in Covid lockdown and enables listeners to dial up a local rate line to hear a service recorded by one of the Ministry Team - a friendly voice for those unable to make it to church. More recently, services recorded have reduced to 2 or sometimes 3 a month, but the cost to the Benefice remains at £30 a month - and we have recently discovered that there are sometimes just two telephone listeners for these services. Another option for a telephone service has also become available, listening via the Daily Hope line, so PCCs have been asked to consider whether we continue to record a service and just send it out via email, continue with the telephone service or just use Daily Hope. Anybody who has any thoughts on this should pass these onto their PCCs as soon as possible.
