Did you know that the Car Park at Hive Beach Burton Bradstock is due to be handed back to the National Trust to manage in November 2008?

And that subject to negotiations, Steve Attrill will have a new lease for the Hive Beach Café' in April 2009?

This was the preferred option for 77% or 148 stakeholders, who took part in a community consultation event at Burton Bradstock on the 13th & 14th October 2007.

To keep you informed about what's going on at Hive Beach during the coming weeks and months and to demonstrate our commitment to a grass-roots approach to Local Community Engagement, we have appointed a Visitor Services Manager (VSM) for West Dorset to be the link for the local community.

The hand over of the car park from the Parish Council is scheduled for Monday 6th October 2008 and work to improve the car park is scheduled to start in November/December 2008. The National Trust's Building Surveyor recently commissioned a topographical survey of the car park to establish what needs to be done in order to improve the drainage.

We recognise that prior to and during the planned car park works, access to the site will sometimes be limited, so we are considering waiving the parking fees for a limited period, just to make lifer easier for you.




Getting to know you


So why not come along, tell us what you think and share you ideas about how

It's important for us...and you...that we get it right, so your comments will be much appreciated. Ideas and suggestions welcome.

We will be talking to West Dorset Distinct Council about how we can most effectively achieve this and sincerely hope that our efforts to implement future schemes will meet with local approval and that you will support us in our endeavours.

We are keen to find local solutions to the waste we produce, and to reduce the impact we make on resources, so all ideas and suggestions will be welcome.
